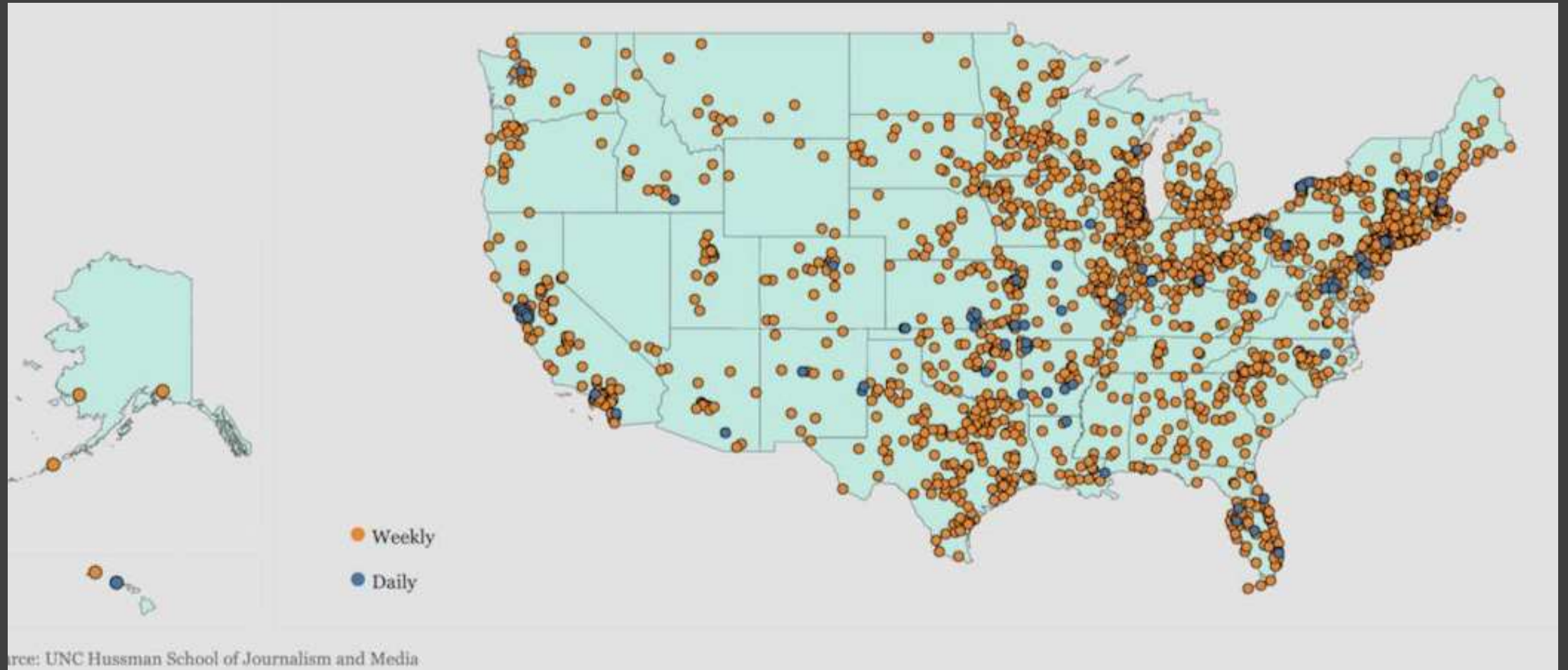

Since 2004, the US has lost more than 2,100 newspapers.



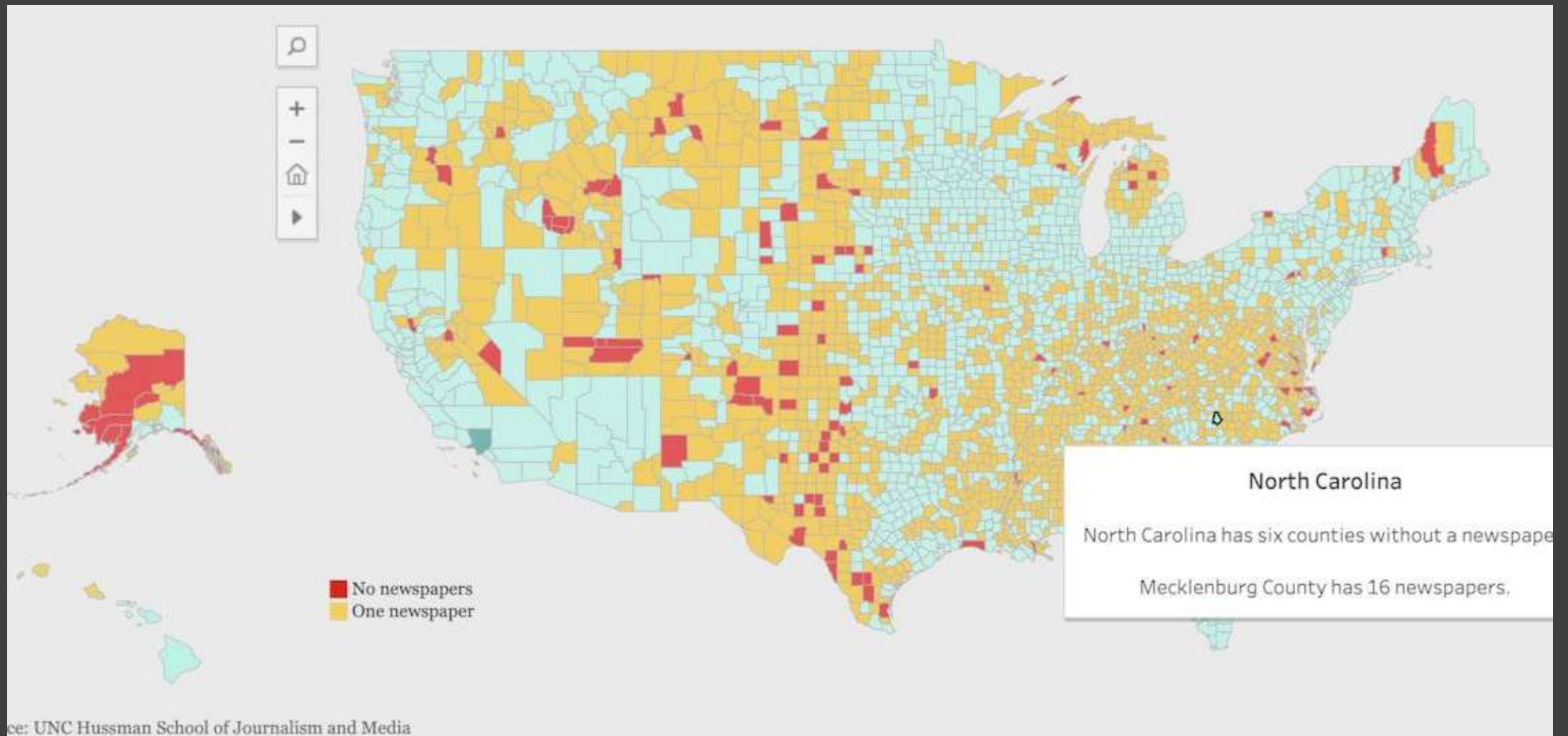
**Vanishing Newspapers:

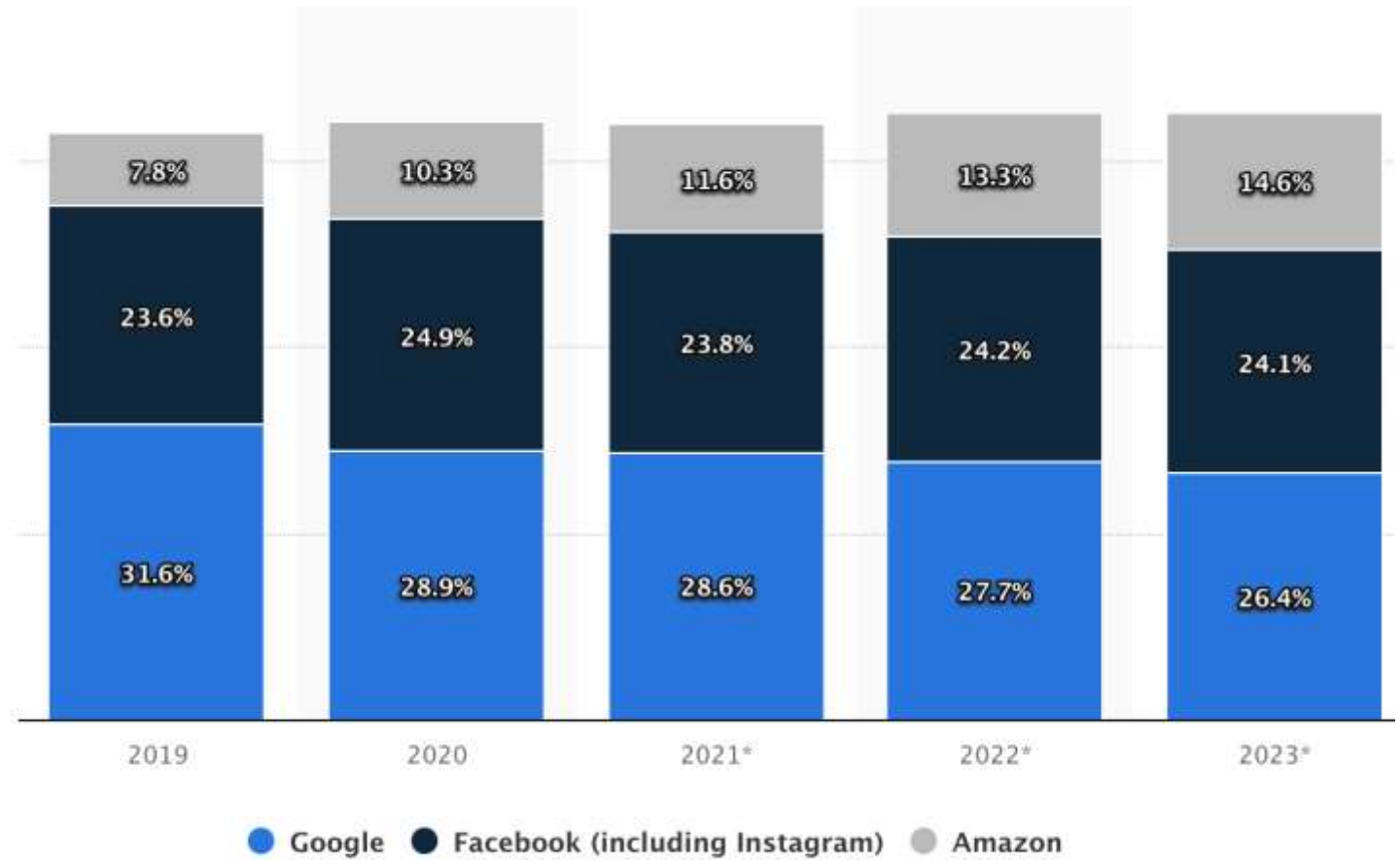
Do you live in a News Desert?

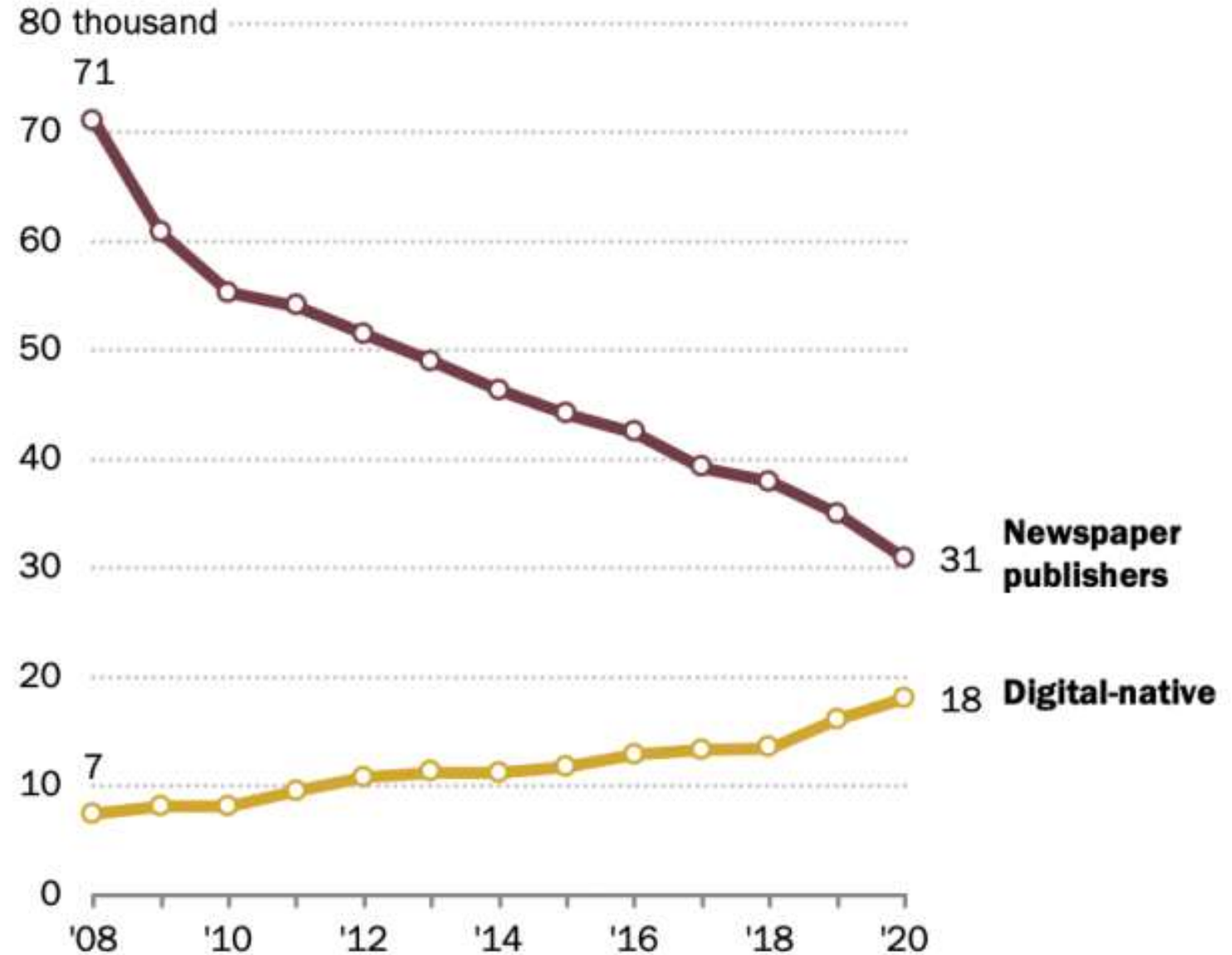
